Background:

In such cases, the revenue will be recognised on percentage of completion method, when the stage of completion of each project reaches a significant level which is estimated to be atleast 25% of the total estimated construction cost of the Project. Revenue is recognised in proportion that the contract costs incurred for work performed up to the reporting date bear to the estimated total contract costs.



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1.4Fixed Assets & Depreciation:
